	Six sighter arrows will be shot followed by four dozen arrows at the longest distance and two dozen arrows at the shorter distance.																
Rounds to be shot (seniors):	To provide for a transparent level of competitive fairness, senior archers should shoot the distance category relative to their handicap achievement. If the handicaps in the table below (or lower) are achieved by senior archers, then the distance category to be entered is Long National : <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Female recurve archer with a handicap of 57 (= 438 National) • Male/Open recurve archer with a handicap of 49 (= 506 National) • Female compound archer with a handicap of 47 (= 520 National) • Male/Open compound archer with a handicap of 41 (= 558 National) The National distance is applicable to senior archers with handicaps higher than the ones stated above: <i>These rules do not apply to Junior archers, unless a Junior chooses to compete as a Senior.</i>																
Rounds to be shot (juniors):	Junior archers should shoot the distance category relative to their age based on the table below: <table border="1" style="width: 100%; text-align: center;"> <thead> <tr> <th>Age Class:</th> <th>Under 18</th> <th>Under 16</th> <th>Under 14</th> <th>Under 12</th> <th>Under 10</th> </tr> </thead> <tbody> <tr> <th>Round:</th> <td>National</td> <td>National 50</td> <td>National 40</td> <td>National 30</td> <td>National 20</td> </tr> </tbody> </table> Juniors may shoot at a distance lower than that prescribed for their age (<i>Out of Distance</i>); however, by doing so, they will not be eligible for a Junior Heritage trophy. Juniors wishing to shoot in the senior rounds will pay the senior fee to do so, and will be competing against the seniors for medals. Juniors wishing to shoot a higher round than their own (within the junior rounds) will still pay the junior fee, but will compete against the age group they are shooting in for medals. 	N.B. A junior's "age class" is based on their age on 1st January 2026 and they remain in that "age class" all year long.
Club awards:	The host club, Archers of Teme, will present awards as follows: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • For archers shooting in the correct distance category (known as "<i>In Distance</i>"), club medals will be awarded to 1st, 2nd and 3rd places in each category, e.g. Long National - Recurve Open. • For archers shooting in the disabled category, club medals will be awarded to 1st, 2nd and 3rd places in each category, e.g. National 30 - Compound Female Disabled. • For archers not shooting in the correct distance category (known as "<i>Out of Distance</i>"), one set of club medals (1st, 2nd, and 3rd) will be awarded to senior participants and a separate set of medals to junior participants, as adjusted scores will be used to compare archers within each group.
Rules and dress code:	Archery GB Rules of Shooting will apply. Only clothing in compliance with Rule 307 will be permitted. Archer's names, manufacturers logos, club logos and sponsors logos are allowed. The only other wording or logos permissible must represent archery organisations. The tournament organisers have the right to exclude any persons from the field for unreasonable behaviour. The Judge is responsible for the safe conduct of the shoot at all times and the Judge's decision is final and must be obeyed.
Lost arrows:	All arrows must be accounted for. In accordance with Archery GB rules, searches for lost arrows must not delay shooting. Searches for lost arrows may continue after completion of the tournament when the work party may assist. Lost arrows must be reported to a Judge or the tournament organisers (please remember to inform them if you later find the arrow). It is the archer's responsibility to account for all arrows before leaving the field. It would be advantageous if all carbon arrows were fitted with pin nocks, as this would assist when searching for potential lost arrows.
Data protection:	By entering this competition, you agree that information may be collected and shared with tournament organisers, scoring systems, Archery GB and other competitors. The information collected includes name, age class, gender class, bow style, date of birth (if junior), club, round, disability information (Y/N), e-mail, and contact telephone number. Some information may also be published on www.archerygb.org.uk and www.shropshirearcherysociety.co.uk in the form of target lists and results: name, bow style, age class, club, round, disabled (Y/N).
Photography:	In view of the provisions laid down in the Archery GB Protection of Children and Vulnerable Adults Policy, anyone wishing to take photographs at this event must register with the organiser before the start of the competition at the check-in tent on arrival.
Juniors:	All competitors under the age of 18 must be supervised by a parent, guardian or other nominated responsible adult.
Parking:	There is plenty of parking near the shooting field. Please ensure that you park within the designated areas or where instructed to by the parking steward.
Smoking and alcohol:	Alcohol and smoking, including e-cigarettes and vaping, is NOT permitted anywhere within the Moor Park School grounds.
Refreshments:	Light refreshments available in the afternoon. Tea, coffee and squash will be available from 11:00hrs.
Stoves/Burners:	Please be aware that no naked flames (e.g. camping stoves) are permitted anywhere on site.
Safeguarding:	Any concerns of suspicious activity should be raised with the Judge or tournament organisers on the day.

From the south take the A49 for 1.8 miles north from the Woofferton crossroads (A456/B4362). Turn left on to the B4361 towards Ludlow. Travel 0.8 miles north towards Ludlow on the B4361 and take the first left turn (very sharp!) towards Richards Castle.
